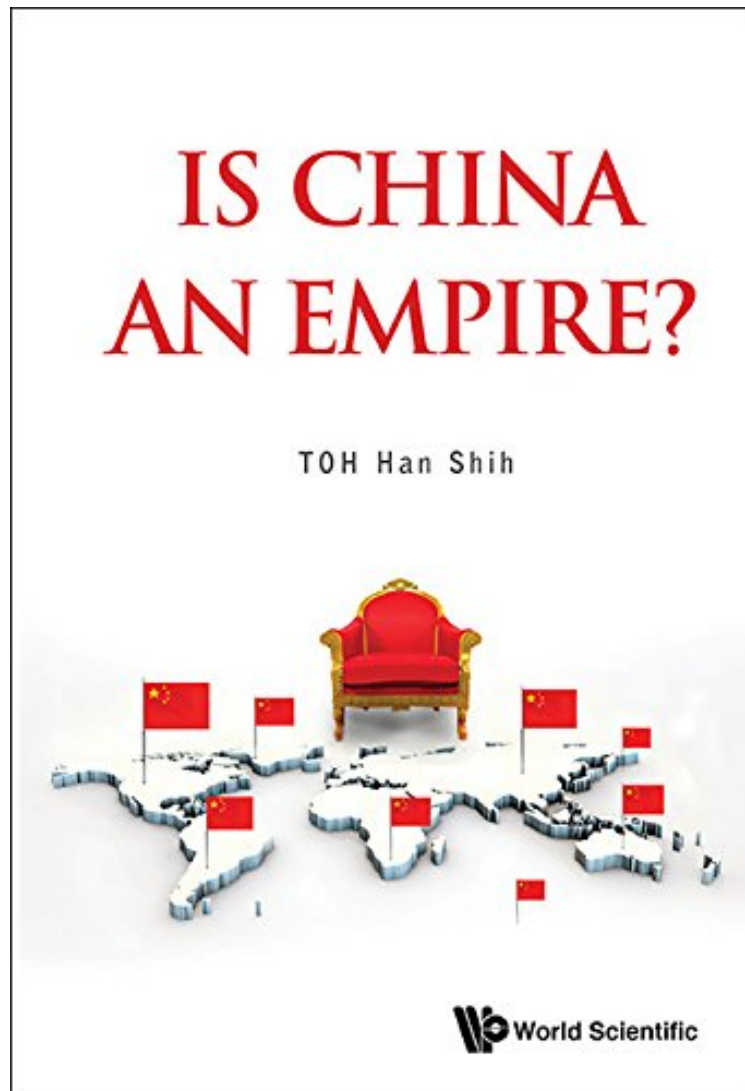

His investigative background - plus his own fluency in Chinese - lends deep insight into this book. "Is China an Empire" starts cleverly by following the railways - a good symbol of how China is physically reaching out to the world with infrastructure and trade. There are very few books out there that take such a broad view of how China, which is gradually taking over the world's land and resources, as well as gathering up more power in its control of politics and the Internet. Although this is a debut book, by a small publisher, it is a must-read for anyone interested in Chinese business or politics.
